

Statement of Representations Procedure for the Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Plan (Regulation 16)


Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Forum has submitted a proposed Neighbourhood Plan to Westminster City Council. The Council is now seeking views and comments from residents and interested stakeholders on the proposed plan, in line with Regulation 16 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (as amended).

Title of Document

Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Plan 2017-2037 Submission Version

Subject Matter and Area Covered

The Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Forum and Neighbourhood Area were designated by Westminster City Council in March 2014. The Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Plan sets out new planning policies for the development and use of land in the Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Area (shown in the plan below) to the year 2037. It includes policies on a range of matters including character, heritage, community uses, retail, offices, housing, cultural uses, transport and the environment.



Period within which representations must be made

Representations on the Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Plan Submission Version and supporting documents must be made between **20th December 2017 and 14th February 2018**.

Where have the documents been made available, and the places and times at which they can be inspected?

The proposed Plan and supporting documents are available for inspection at the following locations:

- On the Council's website <https://www.westminster.gov.uk/NP-knightsbridge>
- At the Council's offices at 5 The Strand, at Victoria Library, and at Mayfair Library, during normal opening hours.

Making a representation

When making your representations please make clear which document your comment relates to and, if possible, the paragraph or policy you are referring to and its page number.

You should consider in particular whether the Plan meets the 'Basic Conditions' (set out below). The Basic Conditions Statement submitted by the Neighbourhood Forum, alongside the draft Neighbourhood Plan, explains how the Plan has sought to meet statutory requirements.

All of the representations received within the consultation period will be forwarded to the appointed Examiner to consider during the independent examination of the Plan. The Examiner will decide if oral representations are necessary, and who has a right to be heard, or if the examination can be conducted solely through written representations.

Please state in your representation whether you wish to participate in a public hearing if one is held.

Following the examination, the Council will consider the Examiner's recommendations and decide whether any changes are necessary to ensure the Plan meets the Basic Conditions. If these changes are approved, the Plan will then go to referendum for residents of the neighbourhood area to decide if it should be used by the Council when making planning decisions. If approved, it will then become part of Westminster's statutory development plan and will be used alongside the Council's own planning documents and the Mayor's London Plan in determining planning applications in the Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Area.

Please state in your representation if you wish to be notified of the Council's final decision in relation to the Plan.

The **Basic Conditions Statement** sets out how the Forum consider the Neighbourhood Plan meets the requirements set out in legislation, which are tested through the independent examination. In order to meet the Basic Conditions, a Neighbourhood Plan must:

- have regard to national policies and advice contained in guidance issued by the Secretary of State;
- contribute to the achievement of sustainable development;
- be in general conformity with the strategic policies of the development plan for the area;
- be compatible with EU obligations (including the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) Directive) and human rights requirements; and
- ensure the prescribed conditions are met and prescribed matters have been complied with in connection with the proposal for the order.

consulted about the proposed neighbourhood plan; explains how they were consulted; summarises the main issues and concerns raised; and describes how these issues and concerns have been considered and, where relevant, addressed in the Neighbourhood Plan.
