Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Plan Information Statement

A referendum relating to the Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Plan will be held on 18th October 2018.

The question that will be asked in the Referendum is **‘Do you want Westminster City Council to use the Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Plan to help it decide planning applications in the Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Area?’**

The referendum area is identified on the map, which is included below. The Referendum area is identical to the area that has been designated as the Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Plan Area.



A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if:

- He or she is entitled to vote in an election of any Councillor of Westminster City Council whose area is in the Referendum area; and
- His or her qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area. A person's qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be so registered.

The referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2470.38.

The number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 1837.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures that are similar to those used at local government elections.

- A statement that sets out general information as to town and country planning including neighbourhood planning and the referendum
- Map of the Knightsbridge Neighbourhood Plan area.
